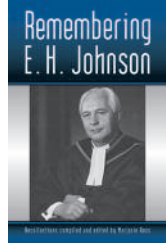

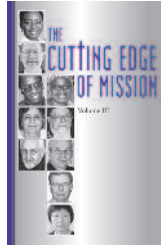
Remembering E.H. Johnson

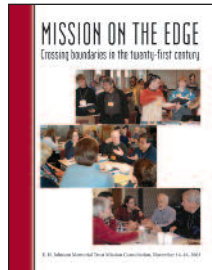
The Cutting Edge of Mission Volume 3

The Dr. E.H. Johnson Memorial Fund was established to honour the work and the missionary spirit of E.H. (Ted) Johnson

Ted Johnson was first, last and always a missionary, serving with his wife, Kitty, in Manchuria, northeast China, until 1941. He served as Secretary for Overseas Missions of The Presbyterian Church in Canada from 1954 until 1972, and then as Secretary for Research and Planning.

His vision and intense engagement with mission issues had a profound influence on the mission policy of our church, which continues to this day.

Ted Johnson was always out ahead of his contemporaries, urging the church to undertake new challenges. For that reason his friends and family established this fund which promotes the importance and significance of “the cutting edge of mission.”

Fund Activities

The Dr. E.H. Johnson Memorial Fund:

1. Presents an annual Award recognizing outstanding mission leadership in the global Christian Community.
2. Sponsors the E.H. Johnson reception, a highlight of each year's General Assembly.
3. Funds exchanges between The Presbyterian Church in Canada and its partner Churches abroad.

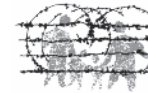
