MODERATOR'S PRAYER ON NOV. 24, 2017 – FOLLOWING ATTACK ON MOSQUE

I am sitting in a fast food restaurant in North Bay on the morning of Fri., Nov. 24. I just saw the news of the bombing of the mosque in the North Sinai, which BBC is reporting killed 235 people at prayer. I have not thought deeply, I am responding out of emotion. This may feel very raw.

How long will be people be killed as they gather to worship? How long will people be killed as they express their religious commitments in a place of worship? How long must religious leaders make protecting worshippers from mayhem and murder part of their planning and thinking?
