**AN INVITATION FROM THE MODERATOR TO JOIN CHRISTIANS AROUND THE WORLD  
IN PRAYER AND FASTING FOR PEACE IN SOUTH SUDAN  
AND THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO**

Pope Francis has invited Christians to pray and fast on Feb. 23 (which is in the week that starts Lent for those Christians on the Gregorian Calendar) for peace in South Sudan and the Democratic Republic of Congo; the World Council of Churches is joining his call.

A portion of the letter from the Rev. Dr. Olav Fykse Tveit, the General Secretary of the WCC, reads:

*"In the Democratic Republic of Congo, 4.3 million people are displaced throughout the country and 13.1 million people will be in need of humanitarian assistance throughout the country this year.*

*"In South Sudan, during the past four years of conflict, 2 million people have fled the young nation as refugees and about 1.9 million people are internally displaced. An additional 7 million people inside the country—almost two-thirds of the remaining population—need humanitarian assistance.*

*"Children, young men, and women have been among the most affected. Millions of women and girls are exposed to gender-based violence in these crisis-affected areas.*

*"The churches and communities are dedicated and present in these communities, accompanying the affected people through these challenging times. We acknowledge the courageous and hopeful work that carries on each day to serve the people in need. May the prayers of all Christians on 23 February for the gift of peace be a sign of solidarity and closeness to those suffering in South Sudan and DRC."*

Clearly, the need is great and we are invited to pray, lifting up the people of this region of the world before God in prayer in a special way on Feb. 23. While these difficult situations seem far away in Africa, they are really very close to us. A family supported by the Presbytery of Winnipeg comes from South Sudan. I am in regular contact with clergy in Winnipeg who fled the DRC.

I realize fasting is not a usual Presbyterian spiritual practice. For those who are unused to this practice or who for health reasons are unable to fast I offer another suggestion, which I intend to take up. On Feb. 23, instead of exploring social media, take the time you would use doing that to pray for these crises, for God's mercy to flow. So fast from social media (or from watching TV, or...) and turn that time into prayer for South Sudan and the Democratic Republic of Congo.

Please invite others to this global out-pouring of prayer that our voices may be joined with millions of others around the world on Feb. 23. If possible please find a way to announce this special day of prayer this Sunday.

We rejoice that we can join with millions and millions of Christians in praying this day for South Sudan and the Democratic Republic of Congo.
