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Getting to Zero: Zero Discrimination

The World AIDS Campaign theme for 2011 is Getting to Zero. Backed by the United Nations, the campaign focuses on zero new infections, zero discrimination, and zero AIDS related deaths.

- ◆ Providing home-based care to people living with the disease,
- ◆ Preventing the spread of HIV from mother to child,
- ◆ Providing access to HIV counselling and testing in remote areas,
- ◆ Supporting grandmothers and other people caring for orphans and vulnerable children.

Our vision is a world where all people can access to HIV prevention, treatment, care and support. We dream of a world where the dignity, quality of life and rights of everyone living with or affected by HIV are upheld. Together we are working for a world where no more people die of AIDS, no more people are infected with HIV and everyone is respected and loved, regardless of their status. It's what Jesus taught us to do.
