About Knox College

Founded on November 5, 1844, Knox College is the first theological school and seminary of The Presbyterian Church in Canada. Chartered to grant degrees by the Government of Ontario in 1858, Knox is a founding member of the Toronto School of Theology, North America's largest ecumenical consortium. The College confers its degrees in conjunction with the University of Toronto and is accredited by the Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada.

The rapid growth of the College necessitated five moves before the current building, at 59 St. George Street, was built and dedicated on September 29, 1915. Despite its modest beginnings and the challenges it has faced along the way, Knox College has remained deeply committed to its mission, to provide the finest in reformed theological education

to its students under the guidance of internationally respected professors. Knox merged with Ewart College in 1991 and has developed strong partnerships with many theological institutions worldwide.

Architects Chapman & McGiffen designed Knox's current home – a building that has come to be considered one of the finest examples of Collegiate Gothic architecture in North America. Within these walls, the College provides a home for 103 residents each year. Our residents add a unique vibrancy alongside the Knox student body, and together they help to form the unique community of Knox College.

With over 170 years of history, we are excited about our future and revitalizing our commitment to preparing faithful leaders, dedicated to excellence within church and society.
