- Host a community forum on climate change.
- Learn about your ecological footprint (www.footprintnetwork.org).
- Conduct an energy audit of your church or home. See (www.kairoscanada.org) and (www.faith-commongood.net/gss) for resources.
- Plan a nature prayer walk.
- Discontinue use of disposable products when alternatives exist.
- Reduce air travel. This is the single biggest step one person can take to reduce their greenhouse gas emissions.
- Leave your car at home. Walk, ride your bike or take transit to work one day per week.
