

- Current Membership of PCC is about 50% of what it was in 1964




Membership, 1945 -2010





PRINCIPLES OF BIBLICAL DISCERNMENT

- Desiring to respond to the Divine invitation to engage in loving relationship
- Receiving God's will by making available space in our lives.
- Responding by stepping out and concretely doing God's will
- Surrendering ourselves in humble mutual service

- **A Four-Week Worship Series on Biblical Discernment**
- **A Congregational Discernment Event**
- **A Discernment Retreat for Elders**
- **Follow-up Discernment Meetings for Elders**

RESULTS OF A COLLECTIVE DISCERNMENT PROCESS

- The Wilderness Experience: "For me this was a tangible sign of the reality of our deepening relationship with God—the wilderness is where the openness, humility, trust and faith... become real. We were faced with our weakness and as we waited and 'abided' these spiritual gifts began to grow and 'renew our minds.'" Elder, Kings Church
- A Growth in Spiritual Vitality among elders of 22%
- The Most dramatic Areas of Spiritual Growth (from 30 to 58%) related to a deepening relationship with God and a strengthening relationship with others in community
- A 30% Clearer Sense of Direction in the ministry and mission of Kings Church
- Faith, Humility and Flexibility/Openness were identified as the top area of growth
- *"After going through the discernment process, I think I find it easier to trust God that He will guide us if we are prepared to listen. And this realization of trust has helped to strengthen my faith. I find it easier to have God involved in my solutions rather than try to solve it on my own. In other words, give up control, which is not always easy."* Elder, Kings Church
