My name is Julia Drydyk, the Executive Director of the Canadian Centre to End Human Trafficking and it is my honour to be here with you today.

- by conducting leading research to better our understanding of how this heinous crime occurs and how we can support and empower the vulnerable communities of this crime.
- by advocating for long-term, sustainable change that effectively tackles the root causes of human trafficking.

We must make sure our collective reach, support, education, and influence are maximized to the fullest in order to provide outcomes that benefit more Canadian women and girls now and keep the most vulnerable in our community, *safe*, for generations to come.

The reality is this crisis is much larger than most Canadians realize. Human trafficking in Canada is occurring at shocking levels.

You've seen the most recent statistics:

- Police reported incidents increased by 44% in 2019, from just one year earlier
- 95% of victims and survivors are women and girls, as young as twelve years old
- 55% of all perpetrators mask themselves as boyfriends

Human trafficking is a Canadian, non-partisan – crisis.

Together, we have achieved impactful change already.

Most recently, through the release of our Human Trafficking Corridors in Canada Report, we ignited the interest of Canadians from coast-to-coast-to-coast, conveying how widespread and pervasive human trafficking really is in Canada.

Together, we have already made great strides.

We are making a meaningful difference in the lives of victims and survivors of human trafficking through the Canadian Human Trafficking Hotline, our National Referral Directory, our first-of-its-kind research and our education and advocacy programs.

Together, we will see an end to this crime.

This prestigious award and accompanying financial assistance will certainly support us as we serve victims and survivors of human trafficking, whenever and wherever they need us most.
