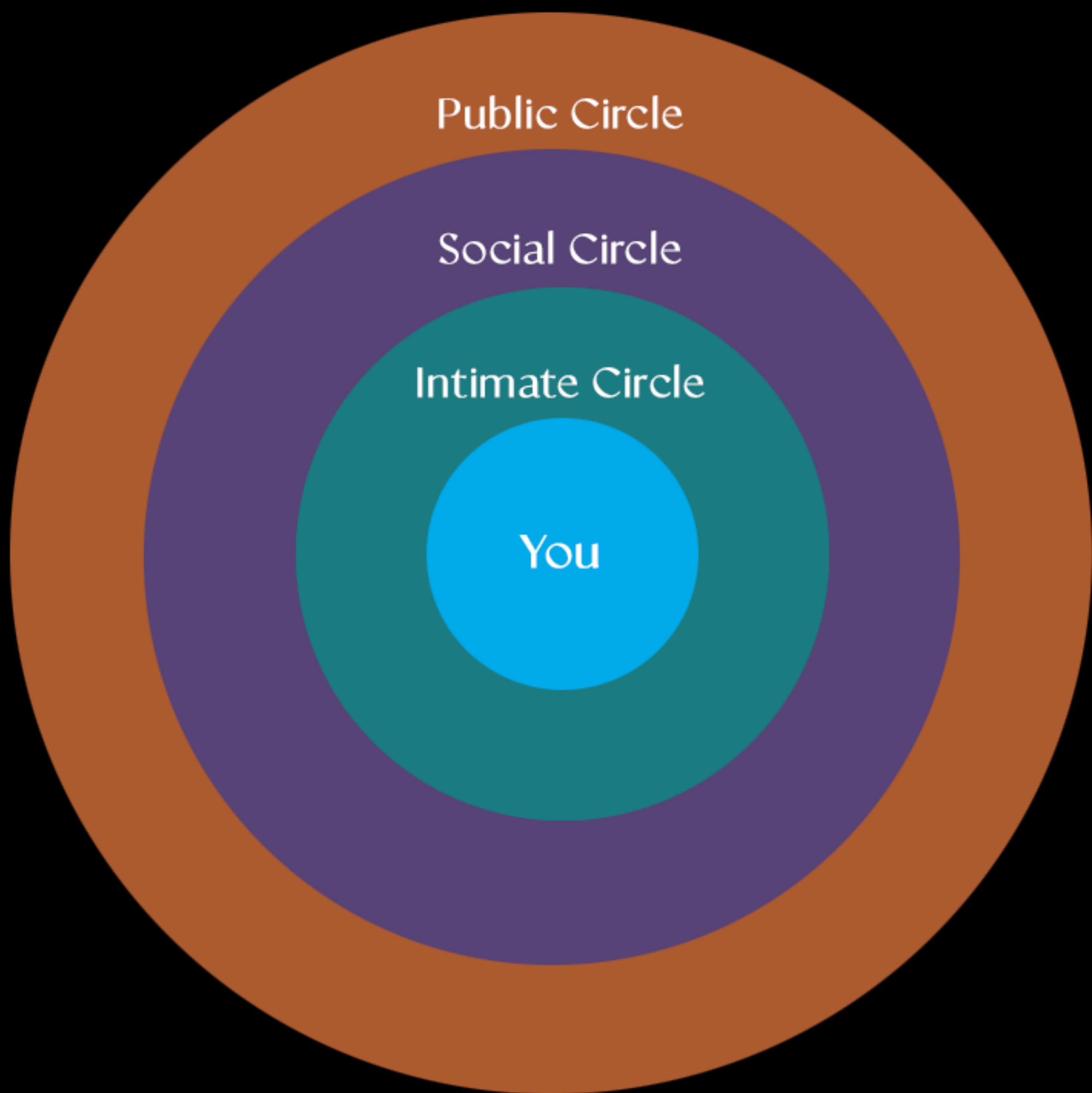

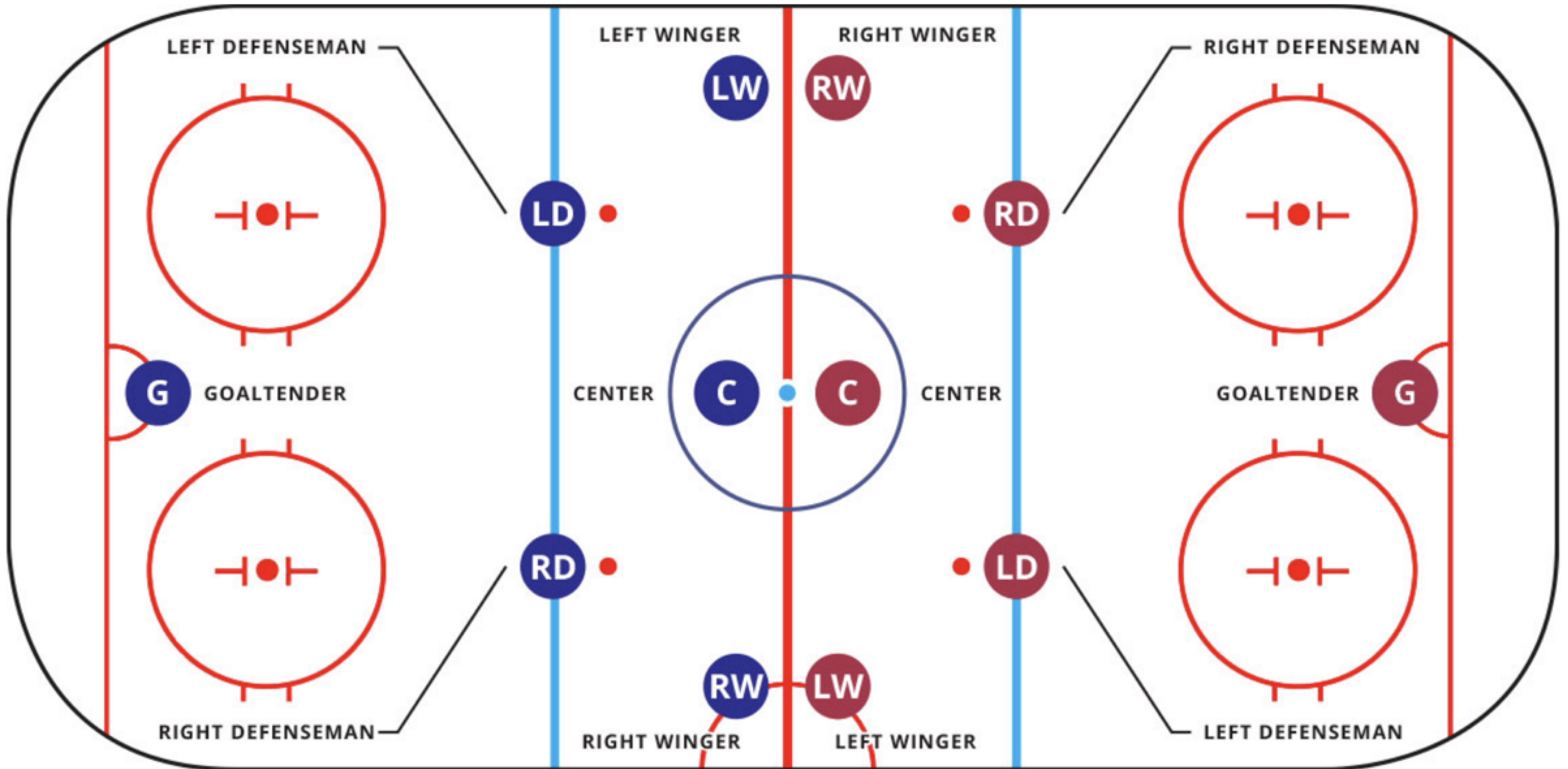

People must be connected in order for sustainable community development to take place.

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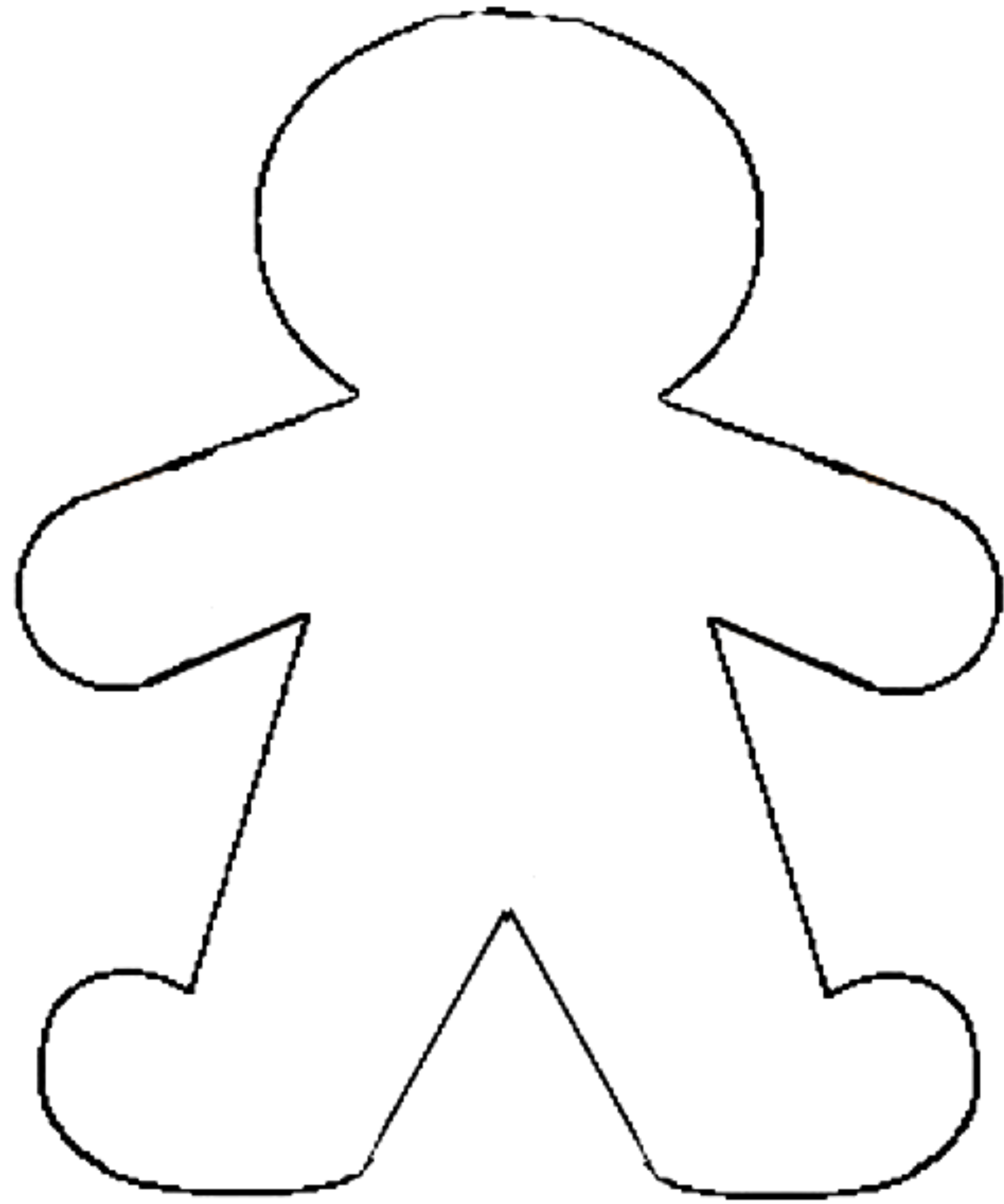
Ask
