

PART I: The Theology of Church Facilities and Grounds



A few thoughts from Charles Chadwick – Thanks Chuck!

Church facilities and grounds are places of proclamation! They show and tell of God.

They are special set apart places, holy places, where the human meets the divine

They can convey permanence, stability, serenity, security, sanctuary.

They can be places of peace, pilgrimage, purpose.

They can transmit something of the character of the faith we hold as people of hope and love for God, and neighbour as self.

A few thoughts from Charles Chadwick (cont'd)

They can foster a sense of awe and wonder, reverence and respect for the magnificence of God.

They can bring about feelings of curiosity and the strengthening of interest in the way and will of God.

They can be places where the stories of people's lives, and local communities, and shared concerns for others, can be connected to the story of God's engagement with humanity through Jesus Christ.

The sheer presence of a church's facilities and grounds can remind us that God took form and presence in Jesus. They can tell of creation, incarnation and resurrection.

A few thoughts from Charles Chadwick (cont'd)

They can have such an important and impactful part to play in serving the common good, being 'the House of God as a host of good.'

They remind us that God chooses to be revealed sometimes in specific places, such as to Jacob in Genesis 28, to Moses in Exodus 3 and to Isaiah in Isaiah 6.

They witness to Christian faith being alive, for Christ has Risen indeed!

They help a local congregation as the embodiment of Christ, to be together for worship, to be taught, fed, and set out to love and serve in the world.

The grounds especially can provide a space where creation is able to flourish, such as a haven for local wildlife, and a place for beautiful flora and fauna to grow.




Integrity of Operations



Purpose and Program

- Purpose:
 - whose we are / whom we serve / why we're there
 - Church is Jesus Christ together with his people
- Program:
 - What is needed to achieve purpose?
 - 1. Worship
 - 2. Study
 - 3. Fellowship (incl. Pastoral Care)
 - 4. Service
 - 5. All wrapped in the Stewardship of All of Life

Safety First!

- Importance of all safety and security measures
- Obstacles to avoid and correct in facility design
- Reserve funding for maintenance and repairs
- It only takes a spark!
- A lawyer can cost more than a repair

Important that church value its space in light of its purpose

- For volunteers, minister and staff
- The original design may not be the best design
 - Okay to move a wall!


The Joy Sharing your Loo and Pew

- It's great when a congregation or camp or whatever is eager to share its facilities and grounds!
- Nevertheless, the sharing needs to power your congregation or camp or whatever

Letting go of your Eggo!

- Enhance programming
 - Nurture generosity of congregation
- Rentals increase church revenue
- Proceeds in excess of costs
 - Labour
 - Operations
 - Debt retirement
 - Reserve funds
- Protection of investment
- Strengthening of identity

"Yes, please pay!"



Benevolent and Wise



- Missional
- Neighbourly love
 - Community engagement and activation
- Benevolent users of the facility
 - e.g., AA, etc.
- Realistic projections
 - How much space we can give away and when?
 - Estimate \$ value relative (and celebrate that a gift has been given)
 - By maximizing paid rental use of facility
 - more benevolent uses can be realized

The Help




- Some facilities and grounds
 - Can be too complex and time consuming to manage and care for
 - Tough to leave in the hands of volunteers
 - Vigilance and expertise required
- Thousands of square feet of space
 - With abounding potential... and a whole lot of issues!

F&G Staffing

- Possibility of a church manager
- Merging of PT jobs
- Custodians might not want to clean
- Cleaners might not want to custodial
- FT: maximum benefit from the employee
- Complete skillset assessment and interest inventory

The Science of the Obvious: If it ain't fixed, it's broke!



- First focus on the rejuvenation and care of worship
- Cannot assume poor building will suffice
- Fire systems, toilets working?
- Personnel needed
 - to care for facility
 - to maximize its potential,
 - to have building *ready* to accommodate the chief act of the people
 - At the very least, a good Sunday worship experience.
- A positive worship so significantly fosters: fellowship, service and stewardship

Yes, there are bills to pay



- Our facilities and grounds have been built and entrusted to us to show the world God's love in Christ
 - They proclaim "this is the house of the Lord..."
 - It's good to go to bed at night knowing our church home is well
 - If it's not, we have to do something
 - Look after the legacy as best we can
