UPCOMING WEBINAR: PCC DECISIONS REGARDING LGBTQ12+ INCLUSION

The 2021 General Assembly marked a pivotal point in the approach of The Presbyterian Church in Canada to gender, sexuality and the denomination's ministry with LGBTQI2+ people. In addition to changes to the PCC's theology and practice regarding marriage and ordination, the General Assembly adopted a set of recommendations to guide the whole church to acknowledge the harm caused due to homophobia, transphobia, heterosexism and hypocrisy, to respond appropriately to that harm and to ensure that harm does not continue.

In 2023, the General Assembly approved a revised version of the Leading with Care policy and procedures. It is the policy of The Presbyterian Church in Canada that all persons, and in particular all children, youth and vulnerable adults, who participate in the denomination's programs, ministries and/or use the denomination's facilities, will be cared for with Christian compassion and will be safe.

Earlier in February, we held a webinar to review the updates to the guidebook and implementation of the policy and procedures and to answer questions. THE WAR IN UKRAINE ENTERS ITS THIRD YEAR: CHURCH LEADERS OF CANADA CALL FOR PEACE

Church Leaders of Canada, including the 2023 Moderator of The Presbyterian Church in Canada's General Assembly, the Rev. Mary Fontaine, call for peace as the war against Ukraine enters its third year.

Issuing a pastoral letter acknowledging ongoing conflict elsewhere, the 45 Christian leaders mark this anniversary by inviting Christians and people of goodwill to join in united prayer and action for peace. "Without in any way minimizing or ignoring the suffering and sorrow caused by war and violence in other areas of the world, we stand together in inviting Christians and all people of goodwill to prayerfully consider how we are all called and might contribute to, the achievement of peace in and for Ukraine."
