UPDATE ON EARTHQUAKE IN TAIWAN

On April 3, Taiwan experienced a 7.2 magnitude earthquake followed by aftershocks. The Presbyterian Church in Taiwan (PCT)—one of The Presbyterian Church in Canada's oldest church partners—asks for continued prayer as the country works to recover from this disaster.

A letter sent from the PCT, signed by the Moderator, the Rev. Phàng Chụ-Fùng (彭志鴻), and PCT General Secretary, the Rev. CHEN Hsin-Liang (陳信良), states:

"The PCT wishes to express and reiterate our heartfelt gratitude for the many letters and messages of concern and solidarity received from our partners and friends around the world.

From our experiences dealing with natural disasters, we can all attest to how a few minutes of major trauma requires months and years of rehabilitation, recovery, and rebuilding of lives, land, and property. We ask that you continue to keep all the victims, their families and communities, and the frontline responders in your prayers for the healing of the land of our precious country, Taiwan."

LAST CHANCE TO APPLY FOR THE I LOVE TAIWAN PROGRAM!

The Presbyterian Church in Canada invites 19-25-year-olds to apply for the I Love Taiwan program in July 2024 (arrive in Taiwan on July 4; depart Taiwan on July 19).

The application deadline is May 6, 2024

Join Christians from around the world for two weeks of mission work with churches of The Presbyterian Church in Taiwan. If you like working with children, have an open mind, a team spirit, a faithful and loving heart, an interest in Taiwan and a call to serve, this trip is for you.

Supported by Presbyterians Sharing, the PCC covers airfare and travel VISAs (if applicable). Participants are asked to contribute \$1,000 towards the total cost and will be responsible for additional incidental costs, including travel health insurance. From July 4 to July 19, local expenses will be fully supported by The Presbyterian Church in Taiwan, local host churches and organizations. These expenses include food, accommodation, accident insurance, transportation, and an exposure program.

THE PCC'S CONSOLIDATED INVESTMENT PORTFOLIO

The Trustee Board of the Presbyterian Church in Canada invests in a pooled investment mutual fund known as the Consolidated Portfolio (the Fund). It is non-regulated and available only to selected investors associated with the PCC, including congregations, presbyteries, synods, and camps, who can become Unitholders. It is not offered publicly for investment. (Individuals are not eligible to invest.)

Unitholders are provided with a quarterly investment statement that shows the investment's Net Asset Value (NAV) and the change in NAV composition from the previous quarter. They are also provided with access to Eckler's Quarterly Performance Reviews.

Fund returns are not guaranteed. For 2023, the result was an increase of approximately 12%, although an individual unitholder's performance calculations will differ if they deposited or withdrew funds during the year.
