FR. BOHDAN HLADIO Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of Canada



Fr. Bohdan Hladio was born in Sewickley, Pennsylvania. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Theology from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, where he was a featured performer and choreographer with the Duquesne University Tamburitzans. He met his wife Tania Pidlysny in Toronto where they were married in 1984.

He was ordained priest in 1988 and has served parishes in Toronto (1988–1995), Hamilton (1995–2005), and Oshawa, Ontario (2008–2022) in addition to serving as Chancellor of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of Canada in Winnipeg from 2005–2008. Besides his pastoral

responsibilities he has served on many church committees, has led spiritual retreats, and offered talks and presentations for the clergy and faithful of different Eastern Orthodox and other Christian Churches in Canada and the USA. Fr. Bohdan has written hundreds of articles for both ecclesiastical and secular newspapers and magazines, and a collection of his articles was published in 2009 by the Holy Dormition Monastery Press in Rives Junction, Michigan. More recently several of his articles regarding the current ecclesiastical situation regarding Orthodoxy in Ukraine have been published on the *Public Orthodoxy* site of the Orthodox Studies program at Fordham University in New York.

Fr. Bohdan completed a Master of Theological Studies degree at Trinity College in Toronto in 2021 specializing in Orthodox and Eastern Christian Studies. His thesis was entitled "Construals of Autocephaly: the Metropolia, the Moscow Patriarchate, and the Orthodox Church in America". Following this he began doctoral studies at the Toronto School of Theology, and his research focuses on the history and polity of Eastern Orthodoxy in North America with a special emphasis on the foundation and development of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Canada. He has presented academic papers and had articles published in Europe and North America, focusing upon the theological challenges facing Eastern Orthodoxy in a globalized world, as well as the specific historical and theological challenges faced by Ukrainian Orthodoxy both in the homeland as well as the diaspora.

Fr. Bohdan is a faculty member of the Patriarchal Toronto Orthodox Theological Academy under the auspices of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of Canada and lives in Hamilton, Ontario.
