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**October 16 is World Food Day – a day designated to raise awareness and action for those who struggle against hunger and malnutrition around the world.**

- There is enough food in the world to feed everyone, but 815 million people do not have enough to eat—that's one out of every nine people.
- Around 70% of hungry people are small-scale farmers.
- In 2017, climate disasters triggered food crises in 23 countries and pushed about 39 million people into acute food insecurity.
- \$0.26 of every \$100 of Canada's gross national income goes toward ending global poverty and hunger, which is about half the amount given by like-minded countries.



God created the world to sustain us, yet hunger and malnutrition persist. PWS&D works with Canadian Foodgrains Bank and partners overseas to ensure families and communities around the world have enough to eat.
