Creating Your Legacy

Through the Loaves & Fishes Fund you support transformational development and relief programs far into the future through:

Making a legacy gift to the Loaves & Fishes Fund allows 1/7 of your gift to support PWS&D's work in the year it is given. The rest of your gift is invested by professional fund managers for The Presbyterian Church in Canada. Over the next six years, PWS&D uses a portion of your gift, plus the annual interest earned to change lives. At the end of the seven years, your entire gift, plus all the income and capital gains generated by your investment, will have been used.

How to word your gift

I give (percentage, share, the residual or a specific amount) of my estate to Presbyterian World Service & Development (a ministry of The Presbyterian Church in Canada) to be placed in their Loaves & Fishes Fund.

A gift of securities

Support PWS&D with a gift of publicly traded securities, receive a charitable tax receipt and pay no capital gains tax on the appreciated value of the security.

A charitable gift annuity

Gift annuities allow you to leave a significant gift to PWS&D, while receiving a tax receipt and guaranteed income for life.

Designating PWS&D as beneficiary of your RRSP/RRIF/TFSA

Plan for your future with your RRSP/RRIF/TFSA and plan for PWS&D's future by naming it as the beneficiary.
