



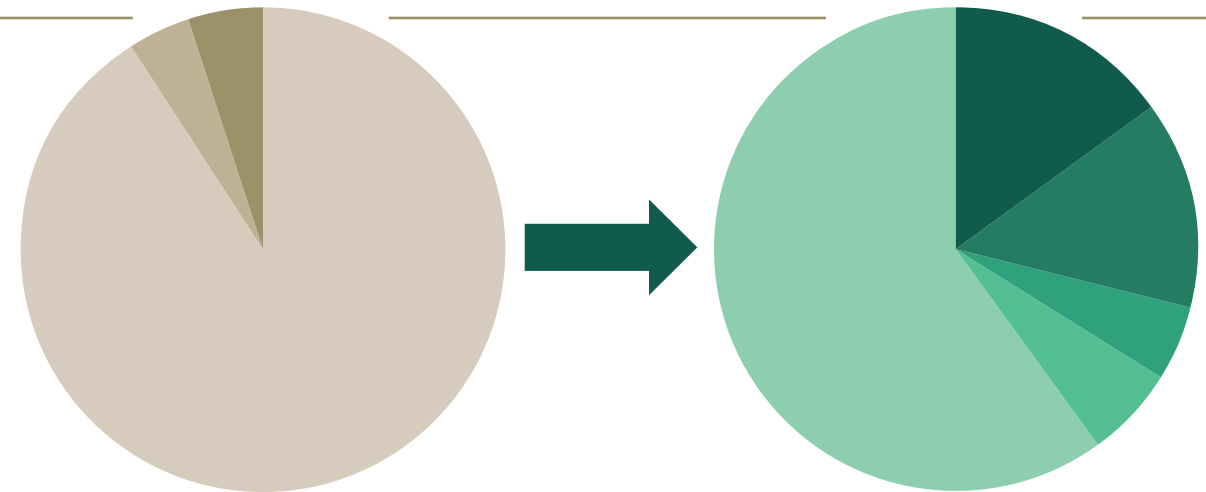

In 2024, PWS&D led projects at Canadian Foodgrains Bank valued at \$3,343,267. This included \$547,586 of PWS&D funds, matching funds from the Government of Canada and contributions from other Foodgrains Bank members. PWS&D also contributed over \$751,713 to projects led by other Foodgrains Bank members, with a program value of \$2,499,345 after all matching funds were applied. These funds are not reflected in PWS&D's statement of revenues and expenditures.



### For every dollar PWS&D spent in 2024\*

- 92% Development and relief programs (see following chart)
- 4% Education and fundraising
- 5% Administration

\*This chart represents the full value of PWS&D programming in 2024—including Government of Canada matching funds through Canadian Foodgrains Bank—which are not reflected in the financial statements.

### Program funds were spent on:

- Food security 15%
- Health 14%
- Human rights 5%
- Livelihoods 6%
- Relief 60%

In Jesus' hands, five loaves and two fish became enough to feed a multitude, with plenty remaining. Inspired by the miracle of multiplication, generous donations to PWS&D's legacy fund—the Loaves & Fishes Fund—multiply over a seven-year period. With 1/7 of the gift used in the year it is given, the remainder is invested. Over the next six years, a portion, including interest generated and market valuation, is provided to PWS&D, ensuring consistent predictable support for our programs and operations.
