# CERTIFICATE IN CHRISTIAN FAITH AND LIFE DISTANCE EDUCATION



The Ewart Centre for Lay Education was established at Knox College ten years ago to address the need for adult education that connects Christian faith and

living. The Centre offers online courses towards the Certificate Program in Christian Faith and Life I and II.

This Program is for all wanting to deepen their understanding of Christian tradition in order to live their faith more effectively in these changing times. An undergraduate degree is not required and the courses are offered in the fall and spring terms.

## CERTIFICATE IN CHRISTIAN FAITH AND LIFE I

To complete the Certificate I, eight credits are required: 4 basic courses, one course each in the areas of Bible, Theology, History, Lay Ministry, and 4 elective courses in such areas as Youth Ministry, Pastoral Care, and Ethics.

## CERTIFICATE IN CHRISTIAN FAITH AND LIFE II

Certificate II builds on Certificate I and requires an additional 8 course credits; these courses will expand your understanding of the global context of faith and help redefine the meaning of your Christian role in a broader context.

What is Christian Education? How can we reshape Christian Education in our congregation in order to revitalize the church? Keeping these questions in mind, we will open the world of Christian Education, engage in dialogue with theorists in Christian Education and with our peers online. We will explore and reshape ways of Christian Education for today's church, and create a vision of Christian education in order to revitalize the congregation.



For the past eight years, The Rev. Jen Donnelly has served in Armour Heights Presbyterian Church as their Associate Minister for children, youth and young families. She has directed two Presbyterian day camps, and was a cadet chaplain for the Canadian Military in Whitehorse, Yukon. Currently she organizes Christian Education workshops throughout Canada via Canadian Ministries (TLC). Jennifer enjoys spending time with her family; husband Matt & two children, Niamh and Eoghan.

**Elective Course, Mar. 18 - April 22, 2013**

**Instructor:** The Rev. Dr. Stuart Macdonald  
**Location:** Online

This course will examine selected historical and cultural events which have shaped The Presbyterian Church In Canada. Topics to be covered will include Presbyterian involvement in temperance and other social gospel activities; the impact of the creation of the United Church of Canada in 1925; changing women's roles including the ordination of women and other significant developments in the church since 1945.



Stuart Macdonald has been on the faculty of Knox College since 1996 and currently serves as Professor of Church and Society. The history of The Presbyterian Church in Canada is one of the areas in which he teaches. He also has written in this area including a forthcoming chapter on Canadian Presbyterians in World War I, a chapter on Presbyterians and ethnicity, and ongoing publications on the church in Canada since World War II. He is an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church in Canada.
